Why help??

On Tuesday March 5, 2013, Attorney General Sam Olens kicked off the second annual Georgia Legal Food Frenzy. In the inaugural Georgia Legal Food Frenzy, we had 220 firms in 51 cities participating to raise 612,697 pounds of food. Here in northeast Georgia, twenty two groups collected 26,688 pounds for the Food Bank of Northeast Georgia. That is equivalent to nearly 20,100 meals for hungry northeast Georgians. This year we hope to exceed that number and collect 30,000 pounds in the 2-week-long competition.

In Georgia, 1 in 4 children are deemed food insecure, meaning they struggle with hunger and access to proper foodsources. Almost 60% of children in Georgia's public school systems receive free or reduced lunch. However, only 15% of these children have access to a lunch program during the summer when school is out.

Thus, foodbanks experience an increased demand over the summer months - precisely the type of problem Attorney General Olens hopes to fight with this drive.
